

WHO IS IT FOR?







Level 1: Classes 1-3

Design a new book jacket for the book read, and include the title, author, illustration, and two sentences about the book.



Level 2: Classes 4-6

Write something interesting about the book read, and include the title, author, kind of story, setting, and main characters. What did you like, what did you dislike, and if the story can be changed, what would it be? Design a poster that represents your understanding of the book read or a key scene from it.
Include a few lines explaining what your illustration depicts and why it is significant.

Level 3: Classes 7-9

Write a critical review of the book read, including the title, author, genre, setting, and main characters, and also draw a sketch of your favourite character.



Compare and contrast two books.

5 best entries from each level to be sent to OUP.

Not more than 15 entries per school will be accepted.


A Unique Opportunity for Each **School that Participates**

Get your Students Creating and Reflecting

This is the fun part!

Carefully read and complete the first part of the form, which covers consent, terms and conditions and permissions. Now get students to engage in the level specific activities — whether by designing a book jacket, a poster, writing book reviews, or reflecting on the main character from the book read. These activities help develop their reading skills. Ensure to review the assessment criteria with students to understand how they will be evaluated.

Choose the top five entries from each level, with a total of 15 entries per school (5 from each level). Do not exceed this limit. All submissions should be original, age-appropriate, and created by the students. The compliance declaration in the forms must be signed off by the student's teacher or parent.

HOW IT WILL BE The jury will evaluate the reviews through three phases of assessment - as applicable.

Phase 1

Criterion-based Assessment:

- Spelling, punctuation, and layout
- Grammatical accuracy
- Vocabulary range
- Fluency and appropriacy of style
- Originality of thought and expression
- Word count
- Relevance to the topic
- Organization of the content

Phase 2


General Impression Assessment:

- · Mention of title, author, story (genre), time and place, and setting of the story
- Description of the main characters
- Summary of the plot
- Personal evaluation of the story
- Evaluation of the story's appeal for peers
- Graphic elements and colour scheme
- Layout and design
- Overall attractiveness
- Justification for artwork

Phase 3

Final Total:

The 'criterion-based' and 'general impression' subtotals will be combined to get a final total.





Any entries that fail to meet the criteria will be disqualified. In order to ensure the entries are evaluated, allow students to submit their original, age-appropriate, non-Al generated materials in the templates provided for each category.


